The museum board was very saddened to lose one of



Korean War Veteran Gets a Surprise

La Center's local Korean War POW and founding museum member, **Ken Viles** has had quite a surprise in an unexpected email (through our website) from China! It seems his audio interview and articles posted about his time during the war, caught the eye of the son of a Chinese Officer who had collected memorabilia from soldiers he captured and imprisoned, and had Ken's ID card with his photo on it.

He had watched as his father time and time again would take down the dusty box of war mementos, rearrange and respectfully caressed them as he sung out their company motto "Fight as you say and do as you say. Practice your gun, bayonet and grenade."

Seeing the items and hearing of battles endlessly told, only left him with many unsolved puzzles: Who were the owners of the items? Are they still alive and how are they doing now? What did they think about that war and their experiences? How would they feel to meet their items again after they lost them over 70 years ago? He did not have the same romantic feelings of the war as his father, and only wanted to return the items to extend an offer of closure.
